

RULES FOR ALL EXHIBITORS

*****IMPORTANT NOTICE: CHANGE for 2010*****

The Farm Show has decided NOT to mail premium (prize) checks this year. If your item earned a ribbon, you earned a cash award. If you cannot pick up your check Saturday evening or Sunday from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m., please drop off a long (#10) self-addressed stamped envelope in the Farm Show office before or during show week.
CHECKS NOT CASHED WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THE SHOW WILL BECOME NULL AND VOID.

1. The Board of Directors of the Butler Farm Show has the right to accept or refuse any entries.
2. All exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of Butler Farm Show. The show management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules and regulations as its judgment may determine.
3. **NO alcoholic beverages, drugs, dogs or pets permitted on the grounds. (Only seeing eye dogs will be admitted.) Persons using alcohol or other controlled substances will be expelled from the grounds. Minors caught drinking will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.**
4. Exhibitors will comply with all directions given by a Director, Farm Show Official or any police or security officer. Failure to immediately comply with the directions will be cause for the exhibitor to be disqualified and be prohibited from entering any future Butler Farm Show exhibitions or showings.
5. **Violations of the rules or conduct contrary to the best interest of the Butler Farm Show will not be permitted. Exhibitors or others who persist in such violations or conduct will be asked to remove their exhibits and to leave the grounds. No fees or charges will be refunded and premiums will not be paid in such cases.**
6. The exhibitor agrees to and shall assume all risks of bodily injury to animals or damage to any property.
7. **If you have exhibited in any department in the last seven years, you already have an exhibitor's number. Your exhibitor's number starts with the initial of your last name. This letter must be included when you write your number. Use the same exhibitor's number for everything you enter in every department.**
8. All exhibits and exhibitors will be ready at 9:00 a.m. on the first day of show.
9. Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibits on display from injury and damage, but the show cannot, in any way, be held responsible for accidents, loss or damage by water, fire, theft, or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss.

10. Exhibits and/or exhibitors leaving the show early will NOT receive premium checks; they will FORFEIT all award money.
11. Premiums as listed may be given for meritorious exhibits. In cases where there is no competition, judges may give an award such as they deem the exhibit is worthy to receive. Same rule applies where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered. The judges may, at their discretion, award a prize or prizes of such grade as the exhibit deserves. Placement and premium on single entries in a class will be determined by the judge.
12. **The show reserves the right to determine how many entries they will accept from any exhibitor in the same class or, in the case of livestock, the same species.**
13. The decision of the judges will be final in all cases except where mistakes, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of judging, is proven. In that case, such person(s) as the Board of Directors may appoint will make the decision.
14. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to present a plainly-marked entry tab showing the name of the exhibit they are entering. Any item entered improperly will be disqualified to receive a prize, but the judges will mark the correct name of the entry on the tag for the benefit of the owner. If award ribbons are stolen or destroyed, the exhibitor may receive a duplicate, free of charge, at the close of the show.
15. Committees reserve the right to refuse any entry. Furthermore, the committees reserve the right to bar from competition animals, vegetables, flowers, poultry products and home-produced articles of decidedly inferior quality and/or those not possessing sufficient merit to warrant recognition.
16. **If the show management believes that any exhibits were made in previous years or not made by the exhibitor, those exhibits may be refused or disqualified.**
17. The show management may, at any time, order the removal of any exhibit or part of exhibit in bad condition, and any article unfit to show may be excluded. Exhibits may NOT be removed at any time before the close of the show except by consent of the management. **Removal of an exhibit without consent of the department superintendent will forfeit all premiums.**
18. During the judging, buildings, except livestock arenas, are closed to everyone except fair officials, judges, and necessary attendants. An exhibitor or his/her agent shall NOT communicate with the judge during time of determining the awards, except to answer questions proposed by the judges. Any exhibitor interfering with the judge while making awards shall forfeit any premiums to which he would otherwise be entitled.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ALL LIVESTOCK SHOWS

CHECKS NOT CASHED WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THE SHOW WILL BECOME NULL AND VOID.

A CERTIFICATE OF LIABILITY INSURANCE is a free service provided by most insurance companies. Call your company before July 14, give them the dates of the Farm Show, and they will fax us (724-482-9118) a certificate showing that you have current liability insurance.

1. Refer to General Rules on the previous pages and Health Rules for each species on the following pages. **Animals will NOT BE ADMITTED to the Farm Show unless these health requirements have been fulfilled.**
2. **The department superintendents have the final judgment in resolving any and all disputes.**
3. Exhibitors are expected to display their animals as directed by the committee; accept the stall assignment without controversy; keep their animals in an attractive appearance; and cooperate in every way that may serve to increase the educational value of the show.
4. Animals with horns will NOT be shown or displayed at the Butler Farm Show.
5. **All livestock entries and fees must be submitted to the Farm Show secretary by July 14. All livestock exhibitors MUST provide a Certificate of Liability Insurance and a Vet/Client Form (provided in the back of this book) with the entry form and fees.**
6. Entry fees are NOT refundable.
7. The Livestock Committee or designated representative is responsible for checking all Certificates of Veterinary Inspections & Vet-Client Relationship Forms.
8. Feed and bedding must be furnished by the exhibitors.
9. Livestock breeding and market animals will NOT be accepted before 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, August 8, but they must be in the stalls/barns by 5:00 p.m. that day. They must remain until 9:00 p.m. Saturday, August 14.
10. **Exhibits and/or exhibitors leaving the show early will NOT receive premium checks; they will FORFEIT all award money.**
11. All market **beef and lambs** must be slick sheared (1/4" maximum hair length) before they are unloaded from the trailer on Sunday. **The decision of the slick-shear committee is FINAL.**
12. All breeding stock entries (open or junior beef, swine, sheep) must have health, registration, and identification papers ready at pens on Sunday at 9:00 p.m. Identification numbers on registration papers, health papers, tattoos and/or ear tags must match.

13. **Animal registration papers for all livestock must be officially transferred into the exhibitor's name 30 days prior to the show unless otherwise specified by the department. i.e. Rabbits must be owned 60 days prior to this year's show.**
14. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing when their animals will be judged. Stock must be in the ring promptly when called. Late entries will not be allowed to enter the ring and will be out of competition. Decorations with ribbons or ornaments previously won by animals are prohibited until after the awards have been made in their respective classes by the judges.
15. Overfitting of cattle will be discriminated against. Any artificial means used to change the form or shape of an animal will disqualify it from competition.
16. Be sure to use only grooming products that are approved for use on market and dairy animals when fitting your cattle for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat or milk. If you are not certain that a product is residue safe and approved for use on meat or dairy animals, **do not use it!** **IMPORTANT!** If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics or any chemical from fitting products is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.
17. **Interference with judges will not be tolerated. Interfering exhibitors, including immediate family members, will be barred from competition.** The only people ALLOWED in the ring during judging are the judge, breed chairman, and necessary attendants.
18. Should any animal awarded a prize be disqualified, the animals earning the lower prizes will move into the next higher position if, in the opinion of the judges, the animals are worthy of such prizes.
19. When on exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under halter and in charge of the owner or employee.
20. Any animal of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show conditions must be removed from the show grounds.
21. Every exhibit accepted for premiums must be clearly labeled. The breed name must be shown on cards large enough to be readily identified by the viewers, or if the livestock is grouped together according to breed one large sign to designate the group will be satisfactory. However, the award ribbons must be placed on the stall or pen of the individual winners for the duration of the show. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in forfeiture of premiums. It will be the duty of the show officials to see that this regulation is followed. If award ribbons are stolen or destroyed, the exhibitor may receive a duplicate, free of charge, at the close of the show.
22. Each person exhibiting livestock will be issued one exhibitor's pass.
23. **Open exhibitors are limited to two paid entries per class per exhibitor.**
24. **The Committee reserves the right to reject entries once the stall space allotments have been filled.**

- (1) A CERTIFICATE OF LIABILITY INSURANCE,
- (2) NEGATIVE COGGINS, (3) PROOF OF RABIES,
- (4) A CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION ISSUED AFTER MAY 1, 2010, AND
- (5) A VET-CLIENT FORM (IN BACK OF BOOK) WITH THE (6) ENTRY FORM AND (7) FEES.

NOTE: STALLS WILL BE ASSIGNED AS THE ENTRIES ARE RECEIVED. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE BARNS ARE FILLED. ENTRIES ACCEPTED ONLY IF ACCOMPANIED BY ALL THE PAPERWORK LISTED ABOVE.

NOTE: Please read all rules carefully; changes have been made.

1. Refer to Rules & Regulations for all Livestock Shows (Page 23) and to Health Rules for Equines (Page 25)
2. ALL EXHIBITORS MUST PROVIDE THEIR OWN BEDDING & FEED. Sawdust will NOT be provided by the Farm Show; ground fees will NOT be charged.
3. All classes must be pre-entered by July 14. RINGSIDE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
4. Exhibitors must have an exhibitor's number. Call the office in July to obtain a new number or retrieve your number from previous years.
5. Entries must be in the stalls on the grounds by 9:00 a.m. on Monday of Farm Show week. EQUINES MAY NOT COME IN BEFORE FRIDAY, AUGUST 6.
6. Check in time for equine exhibitors is 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Sunday evening at Elmer's Camper.
7. Release time is 9:00 p.m. Saturday of Farm Show week. Exhibits and/or exhibitors leaving the show early will NOT receive premium checks; they will FORFEIT all award money.
8. The Farm Show reserves the right to refuse any or all entries.
9. Decisions of the Horse Show Committee take precedence over all written material.
10. Any complaints must be made through the show committee. Anyone not doing so may be asked to leave the Farm Show and forfeit any premiums.

11. All stallions must be tied at all times. No exhibitor under the age of 18, as of January 1, is permitted to handle or show a stallion. Grade stallions may NOT be entered.
12. An entered equine must be shown and compete in only one halter class except in group classes. Hitch classes are optional.
13. Any horse or team of horses shall NOT be entitled to a premium unless serviceably sound.
14. Horses entered as matched pairs must be owned by one person or firm.
15. Box stalls are for MARE AND FOAL only. Single horses will use tie stalls.
16. No one is permitted to stay/sleep in the barn overnight.
17. Stalls and walkways must be kept clean and free from clutter at all times.
18. Exhibitors not cleaning stalls at close of Farm Show will forfeit their premium money.
19. ALL HANDLERS & DRIVERS OF DRAFT HORSES MUST BE 8 YEARS OLD OR OLDER AND ACCOMPANIED BY AN EXPERIENCED ADULT DRIVER.
20. ANY DRIVER UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE (AS OF JANUARY 1) MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN EXPERIENCED ADULT DRIVER AND HEADER.
21. Equines must be entered in the proper sections and classes on the appropriate entry form. If you are not able to participate in an entered class, notify announcer BEFORE the class begins. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to make known the proper name of the breed of livestock they are entering. Any animal entered improperly will be disqualified to receive a premium.
22. All classes will begin at the time scheduled in the premium book. The book will be followed. Class will be announced 5 minutes before the gates are closed. Time will be allowed between multiple hitch classes. Only enter the classes for which you can be ready. If changes are necessary due to an error in the book or unforeseen circumstances, they will be posted in the barn and followed accordingly. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be aware of the schedule and have the animals in the arena on time. Failure to comply with this rule renders the exhibitor liable to be ruled out of competing.
23. You MUST enter the show arena at a flat walk and continue at a walk around the ring. You will not be judged at this time. The announcer will tell you when judging begins. It will be determined if all entries are safe. If an entry is determined not to be safe, that entry will be dismissed.
24. All clothing that is worn in the show arena (including any helpers, headers, or trailers and regular or fun classes) shall be clean and neat. Shirts must have a collar and sleeves (long or short). Shoes must be hard-soled. Unacceptable clothing includes T-shirts, tank tops, sleeveless shirts, and tennis shoes. Violators will be excused from the ring by show committee. NO EXCEPTIONS.
25. Only the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform will be allowed in the show ring and the announcer's booth during the time of judging.

26. AN EXHIBITOR SHALL NOT APPROACH A JUDGE WHILE ANY SESSION OF THE SHOW IS IN PROGRESS. If an exhibitor wishes to discuss a horse or class with the judge, he must wait until the classes finish.
27. The Farm Show reserves the right to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the show arena without being liable for compensation or damages.

**DEPT. 1 SECTIONS 22, 23, & 24 HITCHES
RULES FOR ALL HITCH CLASSES**

- Horses may be purebred or grade but must have been shown in the appropriate preceding halter class.
- Only one family or one farm unit may hitch in combination.
- All hitches must be judged, not just brought in for exhibition.
- Drivers for hitch classes must be 8 years or older, as of January 1, and of a competent nature.
- Any entry that is deemed unsafe or unfit in any way may be excused from competition by the Horse Committee.
- Adult drivers are 18 years and over. Senior drivers must be 13 through 18 years of age. Junior drivers must be 8 through 12 years old. (All ages as of January 1 of the current year.)**
- Novice and any driver under 18 years of age (as January 1) MUST be accompanied by an experienced adult driver and header.**
