RULES FOR ALL EXHIBITORS ***IMPORTANT NOTICE***

The Farm Show will NOT mail premium (prize) checks. If your item earned a ribbon, you probably earned a cash award. If you cannot pick up your check Saturday night or Sunday from 1 PM to 2 PM, please drop off a long (#10) self-addressed stamped envelope in the Farm Show office before or during show week.

CHECKS MUST BE CASHED BY SEPTEMBER 30 OR THEY BECOME NULL AND VOID.

- 1. The Board of Directors of the Butler Farm Show has the right to accept or refuse any entries.
- 2. All exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of Butler Farm Show. The show management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules and regulations as its judgment may determine.
- 3. NO alcoholic beverages, firearms, drugs, dogs or pets permitted on the grounds. (Only registered service dogs are admitted.) Persons using alcohol or other controlled substances will be expelled from the grounds. Minors caught drinking will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.
- 4. Exhibitors will comply with all directions given by a Director, Farm Show Official or any police or security officer. Failure to immediately comply with the directions will be cause for the exhibitor to be disqualified and be prohibited from entering any future Butler Farm Show exhibitions or shows.
- 5. All exhibits will be shown under the direction of the Butler Farm Show Board of Directors and the appointed representative or department superintendents. The Butler Farm Show reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations governing the show and will make decisions based on interpretation of the rules as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the show. All interpretations and decisions will be final.
- 6. The exhibitor agrees to and shall assume all risks of injury to people and/or animals and/or damage to any property.
- 7. Violations of the rules or conduct contrary to the best interest of the Butler Farm Show will not be permitted. Exhibitors or others who persist in such violations or conduct will be asked to remove their exhibits and to leave the grounds. No fees or charges will be refunded and premiums will not be paid in such cases.
- 8. Protests for any violation of the rules may be made to the Butler Farm Show Board of Directors by an exhibitor or their designated representative. All protests must be presented, in writing, to the Butler Farm Show Office within 24 hours of the alleged violation. A \$100.00 cash deposit must accompany all protests. Following investigation into the alleged violation, the \$100.00 deposit will be returned to the exhibitor if the protest is upheld. If the protest is denied, the \$100.00 fee is non-refundable. The decision of the Butler Farm Show Board of Directors regarding a protest shall be final and considered accepted by all exhibitors. Video footage, recorded by individuals, will not be reviewed as evidence in a protest situation.

RULES FOR ALL EXHIBITORS (CONT.)

- LATE ENTRIES ARE NOT ACCEPTED in any department.
 NO EXCUSES NO EXCEPTIONS. Check the entry time for each department you are entering and be on time.
- 10. Exhibitors must have an exhibitor's number. It starts with the initial of your last name and must be included when you write your number on entries. Call the office by the Friday before the show to obtain a new number or to retrieve your number from previous years. Use the same exhibitor's number for everything you enter in every department. Entries may be disqualified if the exhibitor's number, name and city are not on the tag.
- 11. All exhibits and exhibitors will be ready at 9:00 AM on the first day of show, except where judging is occurring.
- 12. Every precaution will be taken to protect the exhibits on display from injury and damage, but the Farm Show cannot, in any way, be held responsible for accidents, damage to or loss of property by water, fire, theft, or whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss.
- 13. Exhibits and/or exhibitors leaving the show early without permission will NOT receive premium checks; they will FORFEIT all award money, and next year's participation will be at the discretion of the board.
- 14. Premiums as listed may be given for meritorious exhibits. In cases where there is no competition, judges may give an award such as they deem the exhibit is worthy to receive. Same rule applies where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered. The judges may, at their discretion, award a prize or prizes of such grade as the exhibit deserves. Placement and premium on single entries in a class will be determined by the judge.
- 15. Premium cards or ribbons have no value as to the payment of premiums. Premiums are paid only by the records in the judge's book. The office has that information after the show closes.
- 16. The show reserves the right to determine how many entries they will accept from any exhibitor in the same class or in the same livestock species.
- 17. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to present a plainly-marked entry tab showing the name of the exhibit they are entering. Any item entered in the wrong category will be disqualified, but the judges will mark the correct name of the entry on the tag for the benefit of the owner. If there is a category listed for an entered item, the item may NOT be entered in "Other." If award ribbons are stolen or destroyed, the exhibitor may receive a duplicate, free of charge, at the close of the show.
- 18. Committees reserve the right to refuse any entry. Furthermore, the committees reserve the right to bar from competition animals, vegetables, flowers, poultry products and farm/home-produced articles of decidedly inferior quality and/or those not possessing sufficient merit to warrant recognition.
- 19. If the show management believes that any exhibits were made in previous years or not made by the exhibitor, those exhibits may be refused or disqualified.
- The decision of the judges will be final in all cases except where mistakes, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not

RULES FOR ALL EXHIBITORS (CONT.)

discovered at the time of judging, is proven. In that case, such person(s) as the Board of Directors may appoint will make the decision.

- 21. The show management may, at any time, order the removal of any exhibit or part of exhibit in bad condition, and any article unfit to show may be excluded. Exhibits may NOT be removed at any time before the close of the show except by consent of the management. Removal of an exhibit without consent of the department superintendent will forfeit all premiums and next year's participation will be at the discretion of the board.
- 22. During the judging, buildings, except livestock arenas, are closed to everyone except fair officials, judges, and necessary attendants. An exhibitor or his/her agent shall NOT communicate with the judge during time of determining the awards, except to answer questions proposed by the judges. Any exhibitor interfering with the judge while making awards shall forfeit any premiums to which he/she would otherwise be entitled. Buildings for Departments 11 23 will be opened by approximately 4:30 on Monday.

If you decide not to bring any animal, please notify the office. Keep all animals off the midways.

Use the back way to move your animals to the livestock barn for the sale on Thursday.

OVERNIGHT PERMISSION FORMS

ALL EXHIBITORS under the age of 18 staying on the grounds between midnight and 5:00 AM MUST HAVE a signed parental/guardian permission form, on file in the office and MUST CARRY an official card issued by the show secretary. If the parents/guardians are not staying, another adult must be designated as chaperone. The card may be obtained before the show or on the Monday of show week. (Form on page 208 in this book.)

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS: DO NOT USE SCREWS, STAPLES, NAILS, OR HARDWARE OF ANY TYPE ON THE TENT POLES.

The Premium Book serves as a guide and is subject to change. While every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy, the Board of Directors reserves the right to add, alter or change this information as necessary.

- 1. Refer to Rules for All Exhibitors on the previous pages.
- Health Requirements for each species are listed in the respective departments. Animals will NOT BE ADMIT-TED to the Farm Show unless the health requirements have been fulfilled. Must present the ORIGINAL CVI.
- 3. The Farm Show reserves the right to reject entries.
- Entry fees are collected for all OPEN show livestock, no matter the age of the animal.
- Open exhibitors are limited to two paid entries per class per exhibitor.
- Checks for entry and/or camper fees that are returned to the Farm Show for insufficient funds will be subject to an additional fee of \$50.
- Entry fees and camper fees are refundable at the discretion of the Board of Directors.
- 8. The department superintendents have the final judgment in resolving any and all disputes.
- 9. All market animals must meet weight restrictions to show and sell. Overweight / underweight animals must be removed from the grounds immediately following weigh-in. EXCEPTION: An animal not meeting weight restrictions may remain on the grounds IF it is the ONLY animal the exhibitor has for showmanship except for swine. Swine must be removed immediately.

- 10. The Guidelines for Care of Animals and the PA Code of Show Ring Ethics as printed on the following pages must be followed. The Board of Directors reserves the right to disqualify an entry, disqualify an entry and remove it from the grounds, and/or reject entries for next year.
- 11. Violations of the rules or conduct contrary to the best interest of the Butler Farm Show will not be permitted. Exhibitors or others who persist in such violations or conduct will be asked to remove their exhibits and to leave the grounds. No fees or charges will be refunded and premiums will not be paid in such cases.
- 12. Protests for any violation of the rules may be made to the Butler Farm Show Board of Directors by an exhibitor or their designated representative. All protests must be presented, in writing, to the Butler Farm Show Office within 24 hours of the alleged violation. A \$100.00 cash deposit must accompany all protests. Following investigation into the alleged violation, the \$100.00 deposit will be returned to the exhibitor if the protest is upheld. If the protest is denied, the \$100.00 fee is non-refundable. The decision of the Butler Farm Show Board of Directors regarding a protest shall be final and considered accepted by all exhibitors. Video footage, recorded by individuals, will NOT be reviewed as evidence in a protest situation. Video footage from the Butler Farm Show cameras may be viewed.
 - 13. The Livestock Committee or a designated representative is responsible for checking the health of all animals upon arrival and all Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (paper copy). Any animal displaying any evidence of transmissible diseases will be removed from the show.
- 14. ALL LIVESTOCK ENTRIES must have proper identification (microchip, ear tag, legible tattoo, or ear notch). Identification numbers on registration papers, health papers, tattoos and/or eartags must match. Breeding BEEF and SHEEP health, registration and identification papers will be checked before unloading.
- 15. **ENTERING:** ALL BEEF, SHEEP and SWINE (MARKET AND BREEDING) will NOT be accepted before 9:00 AM on Sunday, August 6; however, they must be in the stalls/barns by 3:00 PM that day.
- 16. ALL BEEF, SHEEP and SWINE (MARKET AND BREED-ING) must enter thru the Meridian Road (Gate 3) camper gate and be health checked before unloading. Hogs will be brought to the back door of the livestock building, checked and weighed in as they are unloaded.
- 17. **RELEASE TIME:** ALL BEEF, SHEEP and SWINE (MARKET AND BREEDING) must remain until 9:00 PM, Saturday, August 12. Other animals must remain until times stated in the respective departments. Anyone removing exhibits before 9:00 PM without permission will forfeit their premiums and next year's participation will be at the
- 18. Exhibitors are expected to display their animals as directed by the committee; accept the stall assignment without controversy; keep their animals in an attractive

appearance; and cooperate in every way that may serve to increase the educational value of the show.

- 19. Exhibitors are required to provide their own feed and bedding.

 20. Exhibitors are responsible for the care of all animals
- including, but not limited to, the cleanliness of pens, cleanliness of animals, and providing feed and water at all times until 9:00 PM Saturday or until animals are removed from the grounds. Exhibitors will be required to maintain their respective areas in a clean and orderly condition, on a daily basis, for the duration of the Butler Farm Show.
- 21. Animal exhibits must be cleaned by 10:00 AM each morning in preparation for visitors. The Butler Farm Show Board of Directors will assign custodial personnel to clean disorderly exhibit areas. A minimum charge of \$25.00 for each occurrence plus the cost of bedding and/ or supplies will be made for such service. Exhibitors found in violation will receive one warning. If the exhibitor fails to correct the situation, the Butler Farm Show Board will have the exhibit area cleaned and the exhibitor will be charged for the service. Repeated violations and/or failure to pay the cleaning charge may result in refusal to exhibit at future shows.
- 22. The show superintendents may, AT ANY TIME, order the removal from the show grounds of any animal of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show conditions.
- 23. Animals with horns will NOT be shown or displayed at the Butler Farm Show, except for breeding stock of horned breeds of any species. Market animals must follow the Livestock Sale Rules.
- 24. All livestock entries and fees must be submitted by July 14. All livestock, including poultry and rabbits, exhibitors MUST include a WAIVER OF LIABILITY Form (in the back of this book) with the entry form and fees. EQUINE EXHIBITORS MUST SUBMIT A CERTIFICATE OF LIABILITY INSURANCE.
- 25. Equines, dairy cattle, beef cattle, goats, and sheep shown in registered breeding classes must be REGIS-TERED purebred animals (except as specified in Junior Departments). Registration papers must be OFFI-CIALLY TRANSFERRED into the exhibitor's name 30 days prior to the show unless otherwise specified by the department. i.e. Rabbits must be owned 60 days prior to this year's show. Original registration papers (not copies) will be checked by the Farm Show committee or designated representative. SIGNED TRANSFERS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. Animals shall be identified as specified by the breed or registry association. Sheep must wear the ear tags of their respective registry association. All animals registered in associations requiring tattoos must have legible tattoos. Any leased animal must have a notarized lease or contract from the original owner.
- 26. All animals entered in group classes MUST be REGISTERED IN THE SAME BREED.
- 27. **SPECIAL RULE FOR BEEF and GOATS:** Owners must submit a copy of registration papers with the entry form.

- Coaching or assistance from the sidelines is NOT allowed during ANY show, including showmanship, market and breed shows.
- 29. Interference with judges/judging WILL NOT BE TOL-ERATED. Interfering exhibitors, including immediate family members, will be barred from competition. The only people ALLOWED in the ring during judging are the judge, breed chairman, and necessary attendants.
- 30. Exhibitors with disabilities are encouraged to participate in the Butler Farm Show. If the exhibitor anticipates needing any type of accommodations, you must check the box requesting accommodation on the Butler Farm Show entry form.
 - Individuals with disabilities who require assistance to exhibit their animal(s) may designate an individual to provide assistance. If the animal(s) is a 4-H or FFA project animal, the assistant must be a Butler County 4-H or FFA member. It is the responsibility of the family of an exhibitor with a disability requiring assistance to identify an individual who is best able to provide assistance regardless of the age of the exhibitor. The name of the Butler County 4-H or FFA member providing assistance must be designated on the entry form.
 - In the event that a 4-H or FFA member has more than one animal in a class, is injured, or due to extenuating circumstances is unable to exhibit their project animal(s), the family may designate a substitute Butler County 4-H or FFA member to show the animal(s). In the event of an injury or extenuating circumstances, the exhibitor must make arrangements for a substitute exhibitor with the show superintendent prior to the day of show. The substitute exhibitor must be an immediate family member that is a Butler County 4-H or FFA member or a Butler County 4-H or FFA member the same age as the project member. Immediate family is defined as brother, sister, step-brother, step-sister, or bona fide foster child living in the same household.
 - During the show, decisions regarding exhibitor accommodation will be made by a member of the Butler Farm Show Board of Directors and/or the show superintendent.
- 31. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing when their animals will be judged. Stock must be in the ring promptly when called. Late entries will not be allowed to enter the ring and will be out of competition. Decorations with ribbons or ornaments previously won by animals are prohibited until after the awards have been made in their respective classes by the judges.
- 32. All animals are required to be tied or penned and under control of the exhibitor when being shown or paraded.
 - 33. DRENCHING, FORCE OR BOTTLE FEEDING OF ANY ANIMALS, OR USE OF ICING AND/OR ANY TEMPER-ATURE-ALTERING PRODUCTS WILL RESULT IN DIS-QUALIFICATION OF THE EXHIBITOR. (EXCEPTION: SWINE EXHIBITORS ARE EXEMPT FROM COOLING PRACTICES FOR PURPOSES OF SWINE COMFORT.)

- 34. Should any animal awarded a prize be disqualified, the animals earning the lower prizes will move into the next higher position if, in the opinion of the judges, the animals are worthy of such prizes.
- 35. Every exhibit accepted for premiums must be clearly labeled. The breed name must be shown on cards large enough to be readily identified by the viewers, or if the livestock is grouped together according to breed, one large sign to designate the group will be satisfactory. However, the award ribbons must be placed on the stall or pen of the individual winners for the duration of the show. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in forfeiture of premiums. It will be the duty of the show officials to see that this regulation is followed. If award ribbons are stolen or destroyed, the exhibitor may receive a duplicate, free of charge, at the close of the show.

ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS IMPORTANT:

ALL ANIMALS AND HEALTH PAPERS MUST BE CHECKED BEFORE UNLOADING.

All animals admitted to the Farm Show will be subject to inspection by show officials and will be rejected if evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease is apparent or if health certification or identification documentation is not acceptable. The animals must comply with applicable state (7PA Code) or federal (9CFR) rules.

Animals known to be infected with any such diseases and animals restricted by quarantine may not be shown or displayed.

All show animals returning home from shows should be isolated from other members of the herd or flock for 30 days to help prevent the spread of disease.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH SPECIES ARE LISTED IN THEIR RESPECTIVE DEPARTMENTS.

LIVESTOCK CHECK LIST

To help you prepare for the show, please read this important information.

- Call your VET to do a health check and complete the CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (CVI) AFTER MAY 1. (SWINE WITHIN 14 DAYS OF THE SHOW.) You must bring the <u>original CVI</u> with your animals on Sunday for check in. (Copies not accepted.) Read carefully the health rules for each species. Consult your vet if you have any questions.
- **DESIGNATION FORMS** for all breeding stock must be in the **EXTENSION OFFICE by June 1**. "Pending" registration numbers must be filled in by **Friday, July 14**.
- CHEESE AUCTION FORMS due by Thursday, June 1.
- FARM SHOW ENTRY FORM, WAIVER OF LIABILITY FORM (page 215), OVERNIGHT PERMISSION FORM (page 208) and CAMPER FORMS (Page 209) due at the FARM SHOW OFFICE on July 14 of each year.
- All ENTRY FORMS are available online for you to download, fill out and mail to the Farm Show Office. Equines Entry Forms are available in the back of this book. Separate forms are used for Alpacas, Cattle, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep and Market Animals.
- CAMPERS may be parked after 5:00 PM on Thursday, Aug. 3, and Friday, Aug. 4. A camping spot and/or hang tag does NOT entitle you to pull in and park at your camper.
- All PROJECT BOOKS (Up-to-date to July 31) must accompany the animal to the Farm Show.
- HORSES, DAIRY CATTLE, BEEF CATTLE, SHEEP, SWINE, and GOATS and project books will be checked before unloading and/or penning.
- In order to show or enter anything at the Farm Show, you must have an EXHIBITOR'S NUMBER. This is easily obtained by calling the Farm Show office Mon. Fri. between 10 AM and 5 PM after July 3rd.

ENTRY TAGS for any ITEMS you are entering may be picked up in the Farm Show Office starting July 3rd.

READ ALL RULES; CHANGES HAVE BEEN MADE. ENTRIES ACCEPTED ONLY IF ACCOMPANIED BY ALL THE PAPERWORK LISTED BELOW.

Farm Hitch classes for Horses & Haflingers require regular work harness and shoes: No chrome hames, No scotch housings and No scotch bottoms (shoes).

- BY TUESDAY, JULY 14, YOU MUST SUBMIT (1) a SIGNED REGISTRATION/ENTRY FORM (211- 214);
 - (2) a CERTIFICATE OF LIABILITY INSURANCE from your insurance company;
 - (3) ENTRY FEES (Checks returned for insufficient funds are subject to an additional \$50 fee.);
 - (4) CAMPER REGISTRATION FORM and FEE (p. 209). An OWNER or DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE MUST BE on the grounds AT ALL TIMES (day and night). Therefore, ALL EQUINE EXHIBITORS MUST HAVE A PAID CAMPER SPOT.

You do NOT need to send your CVI and Coggins papers with your entry. However, you must present the ORIGINAL CVI & Coggins papers at Check-In on Sunday.

A meeting for all equine exhibitors will be held at the conclusion of check-in on Sunday evening at the bleachers in Elmer's Corral.

If an exhibitor wants to enter a 3-, 4- or 6draft horse/Haflinger hitch team, 2 horses of the hitch must be on the grounds for the whole show (Sunday-Saturday)

AND must be shown in halter classes.

The other horses in the teams may be brought to the grounds between NOON and 4:00 PM on Wednesday for the hitch classes. All classes must be entered on the entry form and

paperwork for ALL horses, including the ones you are bringing on Wednesday, must be submitted with the entry form.

HORSE DEPARTMENT(CONT.)

NOTICE: ALL HALTER CLASSES WILL BE SHOWN CONSECUTIVELY ON TUESDAY WITH A LUNCH BREAK TBA NEAR NOON. HITCH CLASSES ARE TUESDAY & WEDNESDAY.

Due to stall constraints, horses entered in performance classes will take precedence over horses entered only in halter classes.

Entries will NOT be accepted after the barns are filled.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Out-of-state exhibitors should contact the Farm Show Office or the PA State Dept. of Agriculture for additional health rules.

THE ORIGINAL CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (CVI) ISSUED AFTER MAY 1, 2023, AND BEARING UNIQUE <u>PERMANENT IDENTIFICATION</u> IS REQUIRED. Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test results with the date of the test and rabies vaccination information must be included on the CVI. IMPORTANT: CVIS MUST BE LEGIBLE, READABLE,

IMPORTANT: CVIS MUST BE LEGIBLE, READABLE, COMPLETE AND CORRECT WITH ADDRESS, DATE, VET'S INFORMATION AND INDIVIDUAL ANIMAL TAT-TOOS/NUMBERS. IT MUST BE DARK ENOUGH TO READ.

- All equines must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI. Any equine appearing unhealthy upon arrival will NOT be admitted to the show.
- 3. Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) All equines must be test negative for EIA by an official test (Coggins) within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the show. Laboratory test results should accompany each animal (a copy of the original lab report is acceptable). The CVI must specify the date of sample collection, date of results, and EIA test results, along with the accession number and the name of the testing laboratory. Foals under 6 months of age accompanied by a test-negative dam are exempt from EIA testing. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam's test results must accompany the foal.
- 4. At 6 months of age, a foal must have its own Coggins test report. The negative test report must be issued to the current owner of all horses and must include an accurate description of the horse including age, color and sex, plus any other reliable identification such as tattoos, distinctive marks, etc.
- 5. RABIES VACCINATION: All equines 3 months of age and older must be vaccinated against rabies at least 15 days. but not more than 12 months, before the opening date of the show, by a licensed veterinarian. Re-vaccination is required each year. (However, if a mare was currently vaccinated against rabies when she foaled, the foal is not required to be vaccinated until 6 months of age, with a second vaccination administered two-four weeks later.) Equines must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. All vaccine label directions must be followed. The vaccine product administered, serial number, date of vaccination, and contact information of the licensed veterinarian who performed the vaccination should be correlated to either the official ID of the animal any and all forms of identification associated with the horse (such as lip, tattoos, brands, or microchips) or its written physical description and be listed with it on the CVI

or rabies vaccination certificate. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, it must contain the name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the vet's signature.

RULES & REGULATIONS

GOOD HOUSEKEEPING will be judged Monday - Friday. (See Section 50 for more info.)

- Refer to Rules & Regulations for All Exhibitors, Rules & Regulations for Livestock Exhibitors, Guidelines for Care of Animals and Show Ring Ethics.
- The Farm Show Board of Directors reserves the right to refuse any or all entries. The Farm Show reserves the right to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the show arena without being liable for compensation or damages.
- An owner or designated representative must be on the grounds at all times (day and night). Therefore, all equine exhibitors must have a paid camper spot.
- 4. No one is permitted to stay/sleep in the barn overnight.
- Exhibitors must have an exhibitor's number. Call the office in July to obtain a new number or retrieve your number from previous years.
- An entered equine must compete in only 1 individual halter class to be shown in group classes and/or hitch classes. Hitch classes are optional. (Refer to page 45.)
- All horses entered in group classes must be registered in the same breed. Grade horses CANNOT compete in group classes.
- Equines must be entered in the proper sections and classes on the appropriate entry form. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to make known the proper name of the breed they are entering. Any animal entered improperly will be disqualified.
- Box stalls are for MARE AND FOAL only. Single horses will use tie stalls.
- 10. Health check will be conducted by the vet starting at 4:00 PM on Sunday. You must present the ORIGINAL CVI and COGGINS. NO COPIES; NO EXCEPTIONS. Originals will be returned after check in but must be kept on the grounds.
- 11. The show superintendents may, AT ANY TIME, order the removal from the show grounds of any animal of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show conditions.
- 12. Any horse or team of horses shall NOT be entitled to a premium unless serviceably sound.
- 13. Any complaints must be made through the show committee. Anyone not doing so may be asked to leave the Farm Show and forfeit any premiums.
- 14. All stallions must be tied at all times. No exhibitor under the age of 18, as of January 1, is permitted to handle or show a stallion. Grade stallions may NOT be entered.
- 15. Stalls and aisle areas must be cleaned regularly and kept clean and free from clutter at all times. "Do the little things that make the barn look better and more inviting."
- Exhibitors must provide their own bedding & feed. Shredded paper bedding IS PROHIBITED.
- Exhibitors not cleaning stalls at close of Farm Show will forfeit their premium money.

HORSE DEPARTMENT (CONT.)

- 18.Exhibitors are responsible for the care of all equines including, but not limited to, the cleanliness of pens, cleanliness of the equines, and providing feed and water at all times until the equines are removed from the grounds. Exhibitors will be required to maintain their respective areas in a clean and orderly condition, on a daily basis for the duration of the Butler Farm Show. Animal exhibits must be cleaned by 10:00 AM each morning in preparation for visitors. The Butler Farm Show Board of Directors will assign custodial personnel to clean disorderly exhibit areas. A minimum charge of \$25.00 for each occurrence plus the cost of bedding and/or supplies will be made for such service. Exhibitors found in violation will receive one warning. If the exhibitor fails to correct the situation, the Butler Farm Show Board will have the exhibit area cleaned and the exhibitor will be charged for the service. Repeated violations and/ or failure to pay the cleaning charge may result in refusal to exhibit at future shows.
- 19.All classes will begin at the time scheduled in the premium book. The book will be followed. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing when their halter classes will be judged and for having their equines in the arena on time. Late entries will not be allowed to enter the ring and will be out of competition. Time will be allowed between multiple hitch classes. Only enter the classes for which you can be ready. If changes are necessary due to an error in the book or unforeseen circumstances, they will be posted in the barn and followed accordingly.
- 20. DURING THE SHOWS, CHECK IN WITH THE GATE-KEEPER AT LEAST 1 CLASS AHEAD OF YOUR SCHEDULED CLASS. IF YOU ARE NOT ABLE TO PAR-TICIPATE IN AN ENTERED CLASS, NOTIFY THE GATE-KEEPER BEFORE THE CLASS BEGINS OR ASAP.
- 21. You MUST enter the show arena at a flat walk and continue at a walk around the ring. You will not be judged at this time. The announcer will tell you when judging begins. It will be determined if all entries are safe. If an entry is determined not to be safe, that entry will be dismissed.
- 22. All handlers &/or drivers of draft horses must be 8 years old or older AND accompanied by an experienced adult driver.
- Any driver under 18 years of age (as of January 1) must be accompanied by an experienced adult driver and header.
- 24. Any youth exhibitor 7 YEARS OLD AND UNDER for ponies & minis halter (in-hand) classes must be accompanied by an adult.
- 25. All clothing that is worn in the show arena (including any helpers, headers, or trailers) in regular or fun classes shall be clean and neat. Shirts must have a collar and sleeves (long or short). Shoes must be hard-soled and closed-toe for safety reasons. (NO crocs, tennis shoes, open-toed sandals or shoes, or flip-flops.) Unacceptable clothing includes T-shirts, tank tops, and shorts of any length. Violators will be excused from the ring by show committee.
- Only the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform are allowed in the show ring and the announcer's booth during judging.
- 27. An exhibitor shall NOT approach a judge while any session of the show is in progress. If an exhibitor wishes to discuss a horse or class with the judge, he must wait until the classes finish.

- JUDGES: The judge has full jurisdiction over all questions pertaining to interpretation and enforcement of rules. The judge shall determine the winners and award prizes in accordance with the rules. Failure to comply with the directions of the judge shall result in immediate disqualification of a contestant.
- 2. One entry per driver per class.
- 3. Horses cannot compete against themselves. A horse may be entered only once in each class.
- 4. ENTRY OF TEAMS: Any team eligible to compete must be properly entered on a Farm Show advance entry.
- Drivers of teams must be 14 years of age or older. Drivers and handlers must be dressed appropriately.
- Mistreatment of animals will NOT BE TOLERATED. Any team may be disqualified by the judge for infraction of this rule.
- BRIDLES: Bridles with blinders must be used at all times. Blinds must be in proper place. Any deviation from this can result in disqualification.
- 8. EQUIPMENT: Blindfolding an animal in a contest is prohibited. Animals must not be tied together in a contest by the neck yoke, straps, ropes, etc., in any way. They are to be held together only by regular lines used in driving. Equipment which may slap or bounce onto the animal while pulling must be removed.
